CODE OF ETHICS

1. Have a sincere commitment to the health and treatment of those that seek my professional services.

Act and work from the heart-center, remember that there is no room for ego in this work.

2. Honestly represent my qualifications including education and affiliations, and practice services only for which I am qualified.

Maintain current records of education, training, certifications, etc. (Provide upon request)

3. Accurately inform clients, health care professionals, and the public of the specifications and limitations of my discipline.

Be impeccable with my word, and cultivate intimacy with the limitations of my practice, and the professional services I provide.

4. Act with honesty, integrity, and professionalism in any and all business dealings.

Refer back to and adhere to the Transformative Touch Therapy, LLC Code of Ethics.

5. Acknowledge the limitations and contraindications of bodywork and only provide treatment when it will be advantageous to the client, otherwise refer them to an appropriate health care practitioner, i.e. chiropractor, naturopath, acupuncturist, psychiatrist, MD, etc.

Be conscience of the limitations of the clients' bodies (physical/mental/emotional/spiritual) and only offer support for which I am qualified to, otherwise refer to an appropriate professional provider.

6. Respect and conserve the modesty and boundaries of clients by always maintaining appropriate and secure draping techniques so that clients feel comfortable.

Communicate and inform clients of the "what and why" for any unusual body positioning and/or advanced draping techniques; answer any questions the client may have and ask that they feel safe and secure.

7. Reserve the right to refuse to treat a client or part of the body for a just and reasonable cause.

Act with integrity and use sound judgement when treatment is detrimental to the health and wellbeing of the client and/or myself as a practitioner; or if a situation arises that puts my ethics as a practitioner in question.

8. Respect client right to refuse, modify, or terminate treatment.

Take nothing personally and continue to act professionally and courteously. Remember that everyone has the right to choose and respect each individuals autonomy.

9. Safeguard the privacy and confidentiality of all client files and information, unless requested in writing by the client, is medically necessary, required by law, or is essential to public safety.

Keep all client files/documents/information out of public access in accordance with local regulations.

10. Respect the client's right to treatment with informed and voluntary consent from the client or client's advocate, this is required in writing before treatment will be provided.

Provide accurate and up-to-date information concerning services offered; a signed and dated (within one year of treatment date) intake form is required for treatment.

11. Refrain, under all circumstances, from engaging in any personal conduct, private affairs, or sexualized activities involving any and all clients.

Outside the parameters of my practice the lives' of my clients is of no concern or business of mine, therefore I need not mix professional and private affairs. I only require information relevant to the issues arising in session and that which remain within my scope of practice as a bodyworker and energy worker.

12. Follow the Standards of Practice, Code of Ethics, and all policies, procedures, guidelines, regulations, and codes which are set forth, required, and overseen by the National Certification Board for Therapeutic Massage & Bodywork.

Acquire and maintain national certification through the NCBTMB and stay up-to-date on the policies, procedures, guidelines, etc. set forth by the NCBTMB.
